About Kamila Wolszczak in short


Kamila Wolszczak is a Visual arÒst, Performance arÒst and Art mediator based in Amsterdam, the Netherlands. Her projects are about relaÒons between the viewer, arÒst and space using performance art, installaÒons, painÒng and drawing. The main topics of her projects are space, Òme, moÒon, relaÒons and body as an archive. She has also organised collecÒve curatorial exhibiÒons in the independent spaces – Universal Self- SupporÒng ExhibiÒons and is acÒve in the performance art duo 'Paraperformance'.

"Faces"

Faces is a collecÒon of abstract portraits inspired by the people who I met with during my ArÒst in Residence stay in Leeuwarden 2018. This unique collecÒon of painÒngs is a face book of people and their facial expressions in the moment of yawning or trying to say something. The pieces are with the colours of the Frisian flag, some of them with transparent, shiny layers which is a characterisÒc element in Wolszczak works.

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About Sithabile Mlotshwa in short

Sithabile is an ArÒst, Founder and Director Thamgidi FoundaÒon, Producer and ArÒsÒc Director IFAA Art PlaWorm, Co-Producer and Curator 1st ediÒon of Yango Biennale in Kinshasa Congo, Producer Art, Books en Wine, owner IfaaContemporary Gallery, owner Chapandoz Brand, a Designer, Independent Curator and Philanthropist.

Sithabile, a renowned arÒst whose work is collected world-wide by both private collectors and museums, is a passionate campaigner for women's rights, who sees Art as Catalyst for Change, InnovaÒon and Human advancement, was also speaker at 2010 TEDxAmsterdam Women. She is the former Secretary General of ResArÒs and 2008 President of the Jury Dakart Biennale.

Sithabile born in Bulawayo, Zimbabwe works internaÒonally, lives most of the Òme in a suitcase but has a base in Arnhem, the Netherlands.



'Sithabile in Fryslan' is working on a research based project eni tled: In Search of Ubuntu, a Colleci ve History, Dutch Golden Age She is currently in residency since 3rd of June as an 'ArÒst in residence' in Leeuwarden where she responds from a internaÒonal perspecòve to the theme: Jepen Mienskip. In Search of Ubuntu, a Collecl ve History, Dutch Golden Age

Created as a research-oriented project, and an internaOonal response to the theme; lepen Mienskip, "Open Community" of the European Cultural Capital Project in Leeuwarden, the Dutch Golden Age, offers a great opportunity and learning curve in understanding the Current State of Our World, Global Capitalism, and issues of MigraOon, Inequality, Racism, and Climate Challenges. This important period of Dutch history, also connected to seventeenth-century American Colonial history, Indonesian Colonial history, GlobalizaOon, InterconOnental Trade through the VOC, Slavery, Capitalism, and later on to Apartheid, is part of World History as well as European History and the global power struggle between England and the Dutch Republic. This project is an aÛempt at re-tracing Historical Steps, in order to unearth the Hidden parts of this History and its Impact, including Our Interconnectedness and CollecOve History between the Netherlands, the world, countries/regions which fell vicOm to the colonial expansion of The Netherlands, what it means to be an open community in relaOon to this and the global impact of this period to date.
























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
